Classical education allows us to guide our students to formulate their own thoughts and ideas. Our students are exposed to the classic books and poems such as Ferdinand, Little House in the Big Woods, The Lion, The Witch, and the Wardrobe, Around the World in 80 Days, and To Kill A Mockingbird to name a few. These books are discussed in detail to encourage their own thoughts and ideas. In mathematics, students explore the truths of how numbers work and why they work in those ways. The sciences offer the students a chance to experiment to find the beauty and truth in the world around us by having class discussions, hands-on labs, and deeper understanding of how our world works. Students are also encouraged to further examine their faith so that they may grow deeper in their knowledge of their faith.

St. Joseph Catholic Academy (SJCA) has increased in enrollment from 78 students in 2019/2000, to 233 students in the 2021/2022 school year with the possibility of continued growth in the second semester of the year. This is an increase of 199% within a 3-year period. SJCA is currently trending an increase of an additional 25% for the incoming 2022/2023 school year. Industry standard increase is 10% with many area public and private schools seeing a decrease in recent years.

Tuition management and allowance in new financial assistance has been a part of the accessibility of growth at SJCA. Our business office is a partner in education to the families it services, and the dedication to help them find a financial solution has been well received. Seeking private donors and non-profit organizations who value a classical Catholic education has been well received and becoming the standard of excellence in providing accessibility to our families.
