








A SHORT LIST OF AI TOOLS FOR TEACHERS

A few basics before beginning:

1. Prioritize privacy and security
 - a. Avoid sharing sensitive information
 - b. Use trusted platforms
2. Always check for accuracy and bias
 - a. Verify information
 - b. Be aware of bias- your own and others
3. It's a supplement, not a substitute
4. The better your prompts, the better the outcomes

 <p>Gemini</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● gemini.google.com or, if using Google, click the blue, four pointed star in the “waffle”.● Login with your email or Google account● Similar functions to ChatGPT (Chat offers more).● Must be authorized by your Google Admin● There are paid versions as well● Good for helping write, create lessons
 <p>Question Well</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● https://questionwell.org/● Free and paid versions● Login with your email or Google account● Free version can<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Create and edit multiple choice questions○ Export to Kahoot, Canva○ Create essential questions○ Create AI-generated readings○ Saves “sets”● Cons- free version is limited
 <p>Curipod</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● curipod.com● Login with your email or Google account● Free version and a paid district version● Create lesson, build writing skills, “Curify” your slides, test prep, create routines● Writing- argumentative prompts, 5 min writing practice, informational writing, narrative writing● Cons- their logo is everywhere, limited free version

 <p>Eduaide.ai</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● https://www.eduaide.ai/ ● Login with your email or Google account ● Free account is limited to how many you can generate (15 a month) ● Not as easy as others to use. ● Generates lessons and assists the teacher
 <p>LessonLab</p> <p>Lesson Lab AI</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● lessonlabai.com ● Sign up for a free trial ● It's British, so "year group" is used instead of class and spelling is slightly different ● Teacher tools and classroom tools ● Some tools are premium only
 <p>ChatGPT</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● chatgpt.com ● Similar functions as Google Gemini ● Login with your email or Google account ● Ask it anything, including to create images ● Free to use though there are paid versions ● Can do a lot...the better the prompt the better the results
 <p>MagicSchoolAI</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● magicschool.ai ● Login with your email or Google account ● Friendliest looking site ● Easy to find tools ● Constantly adding new, free, tools ● Student features available <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Have students use AI responsibly ○ Connect to Google Classroom

When using AI with students:

- Communicate school policies on using AI
- It's an aid, not a crutch
- Remind them to always double check accuracy
- Teach them how to cite AI work
- Always remind them to protect their privacy
