How MCEE Serves Schools

- Tailor economics and personal finance teacher professional development (TPD) to the needs of individual districts (ie, introduction of new SS/Econ standards)
- Offer TPD (in person or virtually) that fits in-district PD schedule
- Provide 1:1 teacher support
- Offer teacher professional development to educators statewide in person at UMN-St. Paul Campus, at an MCEE-affiliated Center for Economic Education (SCSU, MSU-Mankato, St.Kate's)

Student Competitions/Programs

- <u>Econ Challenge</u> teams of high school students compete in a series of tests on economic problems, theory, and current events to demonstrate their critical-thinking abilities.
- <u>Personal Finance Decathlon</u> an exciting competition for high school students to practice real-world skills in managing money and solving problems.
- <u>College Dollars & Sense</u> Week-long summer program combining personal finance with college and technical schools preparation to offer students a chance to plan for life beyond high school.
- <u>Poster Contest</u> The contest gives grade K-8 students the opportunity to show their understanding of economics and personal finance concepts through creative expression.

These farms produce specialty crops such as salmon, tulips, alligators, wind, mussels, coffee, leeches, lavender, yaks, seaweed, ostriches, rice, sunflowers, salt, ostriches, solar power, and alpacas. This journey would be an excellent supplement for elementary geography and agriculture lessons to teach students about less common types of farms.
